Unconventional shale gas development is becoming commonplace in many areas of PA. Marcellus is the current shale target in many parts of the Commonwealth but others are rapidly gaining a foothold as energy companies explore more broadly for natural gas. During that process, there are numerous issues that are associated with the extraction and development of the resource. This session will examine some key impacts, namely:

- The current economics driving the resource plays
- The expanding geology including the Utica shale
- Environment, water, and wastewater issues associated with development
- Legal and land use implications

The outcome of the session will be a deeper understanding of the intersection between development of the resource and the connection to legal community.

Gas leases have become an incredibly hot topic in Pennsylvania recently. Many companies that are in the business of finding and drilling for natural gas have been contacting land owners, hoping that the owners will quickly sign gas leases to allow the gas companies to drill for gas on the owner's property.
